Introduction

Prakriti Resources Centre (PRC) is a non-government organization furthering the notion of sustainable development and environmental integrity. PRC focuses on areas of climate change, low carbon development and food security. Nepal being one of the most vulnerable countries to climate change, adapting to its impacts is imperative. Similarly, Nepal also needs to embrace the low carbon development model for sustainability. PRC is registered with Government of Nepal under Associations Registration Act, 1977. It has affiliation with District Administration Office, Kathmandu and Social Welfare Council (SWC).

Objectives

PRC conducts research and studies to generate empirical evidences, promotes and advocates for people centered and environmental friendly policies in a participatory and inclusive manner, engages with multi-stakeholders to further the idea of sustainable development and environmental integrity, builds knowledge base and shares information, helps raise awareness on environmental issues, climate change and sustainable development through information exchange and experience sharing and collaborates with like-minded organizations and networks for effective and meaningful impacts.

Workshops and Trainings

Dialogue Program on Enhanced Direct Access in Nepal

The dialogue program on Enhanced Direct Access in Nepal was organized to discuss and create the sharing platform to understand the opportunities and challenges in relation to Enhanced Direct Access for climate finance in Nepal. The program was organized under the project 'Enhanced Direct Access in Nepal: An Initial Assessment' supported by BothEnds. The program was organized in 24th March 2017 with the support of HELVETAS Nepal, BothEnds and Oxford Climate Policy. In the program, in total 34 participants were participated representing different governmental agencies, private sectors, UN agencies and non-governmental organization. The program was succeed to initiate the discussion on devolving of climate finance in Nepal among governmental and non-governmental agencies. The program also enhanced a capacity of national and local stakeholders including women and women's group to accessing climate finance.

Advisory Group on Climate Finance in Nepal

One advisory group on climate finance was formed to boost the discussion on climate finance in Nepal. The group was formed with the representatives from different organization working in Nepal. Two meeting were conducted discussing on the challenges on accessing and mobilizing climate finance in the restricting of country.

Financing Climate Resilient Development in Nepal: Opportunities and Challenges on accessing climate finance

Prakriti Resources Centre with Nepal Development and Research Institute (NDRI) in support of Climate and Development Knowledge Network (CDKN) organized a workshop on 'Financing Climate Resilient Development in Nepal: Opportunities



and Challenges on accessing climate finance' on 7 March 2017. The program was organized with an objective to sensitized stakeholders, particularly private sectors on climate finance, its opportunities and challenges in accessing climate finance for adaptation and mitigation activities in Nepal. During the program, about 40 participants representing different organization participated in the program.

Training workshop on 'Institutional Capacity Self Assessment for Potential National Implementing Entities for Green Climate Fund'

The training program was organized by Prakriti Resources Centre (PRC) and Nepal Development and Research Institute (NDRI) under the project 'Support for Strengthening Climate Finance Activities in Nepal'. The training program was mainly focused to the member from different private sector. The two days training program was focused to strengthen the capacity of Nepali private sectors for the potential National Implementing Entities.

Orientation Programme on Environmental Education



Prakriti Resources Centre with the support of Nagarjun municipality organized anOrientation programme on Environment Education in five different schools of Nagarjunmunicipality from 12 to 14 June 2017. The programme was mainly focused on two important issues of environment i.e. climate change and solid waste management. The aim of this programme was to extend awareness among the youths about climate change and its impacts along with unmanaged waste which has become a challenge for the government in our country.

of this visit was to give exposure to the students on issues related to climate change and its impacts on soil, water, livelihood, biodiversity and so on. The guide inside the park showed the students around and gave necessary information regarding the sustainable technologies. knowledge The park provides demonstration of testing of sustainable technologies, farming practices and renewable energy technologies.



On asking the students about their experience of the visit, they said they were glad to be a part of this trip. It was the first time for all the students to visit the knowledge park. They have had a practical experience and exposure through this visit.
